A Year In Review

This month marks the end of our fiscal year, so we thought we'd give you an update on the latest developments here at A Child's Hope.

This past year, we've expanded by leaps and bounds. Prior to July 1 of last year, we had our Baja team and a recently blossomed partnership in Bulgaria as active Thrive Teams. Since then, a great deal has happened! Through partners, we've been able to exponentially increase the number of homes we work with and kids we can help. We've now begun to work with 92Hands (Uganda), Child in Family Focus (Kenya), Both Ends Believing (Uganda), ASOHON (Nigeria), Back2Back Monterrey (Mexico), and Oak Life (Mexico). We've also started working with an organization called BLR (Books, Library, Reading), which supports literacy efforts in three of the homes we partner with in Mexico.

We experimented with a mentorship program with 35 kids in one of our partner homes in Colombia and learned a great deal about how to successfully implement similar programs in other homes. The kids learned how to garden, fix bikes, use sewing machines and more. Unfortunately, that home closed in May and the kids are now transitioning to new places.

As of now, the impact of our programs extends to 26 children's homes and 675 kids. The connections we've made with the government in Mexico has been invaluable in helping us move forward our programs and taking them

internationally. We have 9 Thrive Teams implementing our programs around the world right now, and our goal is to double that number in the next fiscal year! We're also in the process of bringing NGOs together to network and share best practices, holding both in-country and virtual roundtables to help us all improve on what we do. We will continue to strengthen the partnerships and relationships we've built this year, and once we pilot our programs in Mexico, we will continue to take them to other parts of the world. We'll get better at onboarding teams and streamlining processes so we can expand to more homes more quickly and help as many kids as we can!

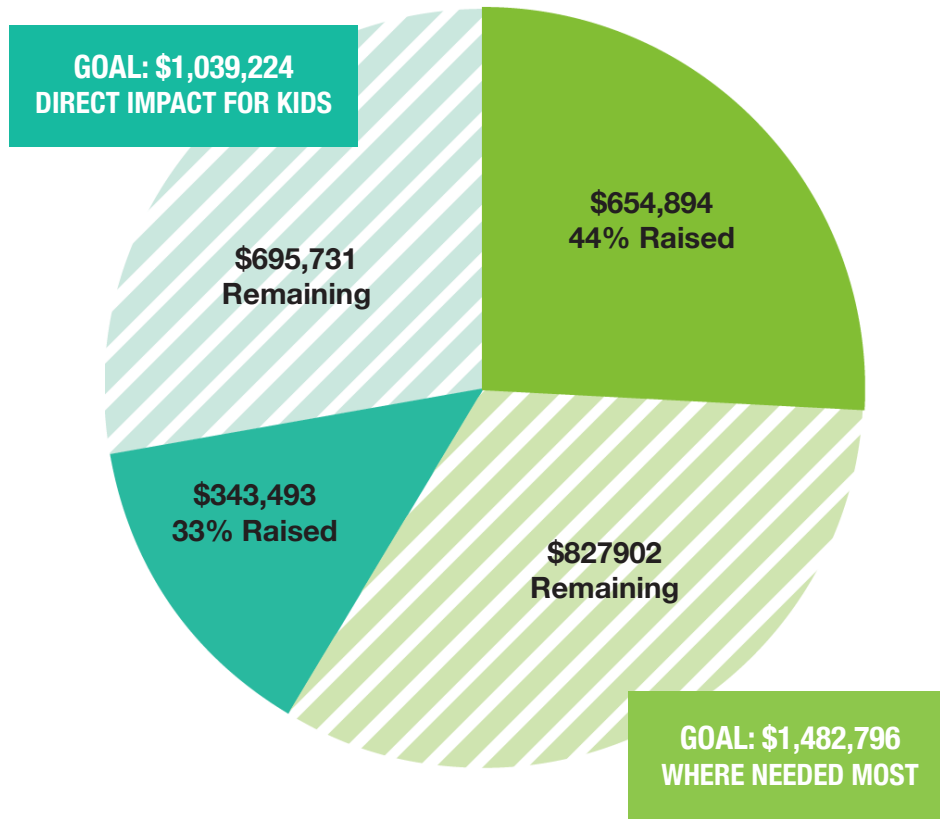

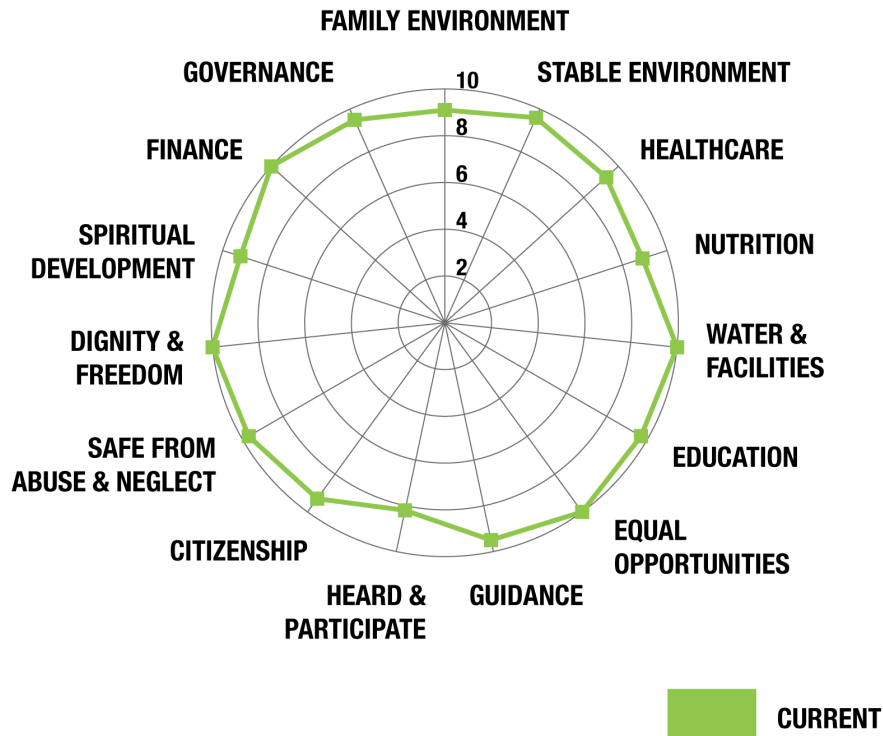

RIGHT TO EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES

- All children receive the same opportunities to go to school, receive psychological care, have tutoring and a variety of books, participate in music classes, and soccer games. They have a university plan for those who wish to continue studying at the end of their time at the home.

RIGHT TO BE PROTECTED FROM ABUSE AND NEGLECT

- Child protection policies are in place to ensure that children are not physically, verbally, or emotionally abused by caregivers or volunteers. The installations are safe, the dormitories are separated by age and gender, and there are private spaces for toileting and bathing.

RIGHT TO DIGNITY AND FREEDOM

- The directors motivate the children to be kind and respectful to each other, to correct their disrespect and to avoid bullying situations. In each house, the children have a play area, appropriate materials, and toys suitable for the age of all the children.

We work with exceptional Partners who are dedicated to lifting kids from surviving to thriving; and the data suggests that it IS happening!

As we look to this next period (July to December), our Partners are primed for more success and growth together. We have signed 12 Memorandums of Understanding (MOUs) for this period. These MOUs are the contract agreements with our Partners that delineate the objectives and key results for the period.

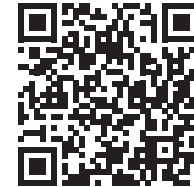
