Building Strategic Partnerships in Baja to Improve Children's Well-being **Featured Story**

A meeting was held this August in Tijuana, Baja California, between home directors who work with A Child's Hope Foundation and Mr. Jonathan López Archuleta, the new Coordinator of Private Assistance, the government agency responsible for DIF (System for the Comprehensive Development of the Family). The main objective of the meeting was to establish a closer relationship and more integrated working partnership between all parties involved.

Mr. Archuleta presented a new way of work that he and his team will implement, which will focus on timely solutions to children's problems, reviewing children's profiles before assigning them to a specific home, better assessment of mental health issues, and a closer relationship with A Child's Hope Foundation, among other important initiatives.

Directors, on the other hand, highlighted their commitment to Private Assistance activities and a need for a monthly report on children's legal status in order to stay as well informed as possible about their children. Other issues mentioned were the need for better communication within DIF to eliminate duplicated processes and the need for government strategies to improve protection for staff members at homes with teenagers.

A series of steps were determined, between A Child's Hope and Private Assistance, on key subjects, like staff training and cooperation with other allies —especially regarding prevention of abuse and mistreatment of children, psychiatric assistance. community educators development, and adoption-related protocols.

All of these initiatives will be managed in a shared agenda between DIF and A Child's Hope Foundation for the following quarter and the impacts of these sessions will be measured and promoted by those involved.

Stove, Microwave, Chairs & Tables

At Buena Vida, the director and his wife have made it a goal to teach the children more skills so they an easier transition to life when they turn 18 and are ready to leave the orphanage. In recent months, Meche, the director's wife, has implemented pastry classes as part of a mentoring program for the boys and girls in the home. To carry out these classes, she has used the stove in her house, which no longer works 100%, causing a delay in the baking times and the duration of the pastry classes. The microwave has also stopped working due to its usage for pastry classes. With the number of kids interested in participating in the course, there is an increase in the need for more tables and chairs. The volunteers who visit can also use the chairs and tables since more seating is needed for the lunchroom.

Medication Support

Currently at Nuesta Familia they have 10 boys and girls who need psychiatric medications to address mental health conditions, such as depression, attention deficit, dystima. post traumatic stress etc. The State DIF supports them with some medications on a monthly basis, however this support is not constant and in the absence of medications the children become destabilized. They need support to purchase medications and thus avoid crisis for these children.

Healing from Trauma

A Child's Hope is partnering with a home in Ghana, Ghana Make a Difference (GMAD). Many of the kids at GMAD were previously enslaved on fishing boats, and had developed trauma around being on the water after being rescued.

A couple of years ago, the social worker at the home decided to take all of the kids to a swimming pool to have fun. To the relief of the director, they all had A LOT of fun! Now, a couple of them are involved in water polo and have even gone to a couple tournaments. In fact, they are doing so well that they will be traveling to Italy to compete in an international tournament.

After a dedicated Social Worker spent many hours and weeks patiently helping the boys feel comfortable in water again, the boys were so proud and excited to tell the director about their recent fishing venture. The home built a couple fish ponds where the boys and a couple GMAD staff could walk down to. They played in a swampy area and caught a bunch of fish using their hands and an old mosquito net! The staff and boys were all smiles and giggles while they told me about how many fish they caught and what expert fisherman they were.

Real and sustainable change is happening at GMAD. The local social workers are doing a great job placing these kids on paths to self-reliance.



Mosaic & 92Hands GLOBAL PARTNERS

One of our Network Partners in South Africa is an organization called Mosaic. In addition to having community-based care programs for vulnerable children and families locally, they also have a software program that supports organizations in managing their data called WellBi. It is a comprehensive and customizable software that helps organizations collect and interpret data. Recently in a conversation with 92hands, our Deployment Partner in Uganda, they mentioned that one of their pain points was managing data.

Seeing an opportunity, our Global Partnerships department connected 92hands with Mosaic via a meeting. After an hour-long conversation where both partners described what they are doing, we all agreed to send feedback and additional thoughts over email. Now, about a year later with some reminders along the way from A Child's Hope, 92hands is in the beginning stages of operationalizing the WellBi app with hopes to complete the process by the beginning of 2024.

We are committed to creating collaborative opportunities for our partners. And what we have learned is that our capacity for connecting partners to one another is exponentially proportionate to the number of partners in our network. As we look to the future, our dream is to cultivate an ecosystem of actors who organically engage and support one another, because unity creates strength.
