Spreading Knowledge and Networking in Baja Featured Story

This January, A Child's Hope Programs Department organized a 3-day event at the Rancho La Hermosa Children's Home in Primo Tapia, Baja, Mexico. Our local Thrive Team was joined by Baja Love and Back2Back Ministries for a series of 3 workshops. Here's a brief summary of what happened.

1. THRIVE TEAM TRAINING

Valery conducted a training with the 3 teams about the benefits of the Thrive Program for both home directors and the teams' own organizations, how to help Directors make progress on Strategic Initiatives and other goals (SMART), and how to further utilize the Improvement Roadmap. Each team walked away with specific goals.

HIGHLIGHT

In role plays, all 3 of the teams were able to present their Improvement Roadmaps to different audiences in different scenarios, which allowed for them to broaden their ideas of how and with whom to share the homes' Improvement Roadmaps.



2. A CHILD'S HOPE BOARD/THRIVE TEAM ROUNDTABLE ROTATIONS

Each Thrive Team gave a 10-minute presentation about how their organizations are working with the children's homes in their region. After that, they broke into groups in three different rooms where board members could chat with them for 25 minutes. The goal was to understand some key questions, like what's most valuable about the Thrive Program, what skills are lacking in their homes or in NGOs, and what has or hasn't worked well when seeking resources.

HIGHLIGHT

It was refreshing to learn that we and other organizations are looking for partners who already have great tools and programs built out, that they are willing to share openly, and that no one has to reinvent what already works. Our Board gained a greater understanding and appreciation of the work our partners are doing and how we can improve. Our partners felt supported and that no one is alone in this work.

3. THRIVE TEAM COLLABORATION

The 3 teams spent the morning together sharing ideas, best practices, and challenges on the following topics: DIF/Government, Working with Directors, and Collaboration in Mexico. The activities and discussions gave everyone the chance to further connect, share common successes and challenges, and receive reassurance that they are not alone. It was especially great for newer Deployment Partners who were able to learn from the Baja Thrive Team and reflect on their goals as an organization.

HIGHLIGHT

This training not only provided the teams a space to reflect on their goals as an organization, but it also allowed them to envision how the Thrive Program fits into their mission and day-to-day work.





VIEW IMPROVEMENT ROADMAP

RIGHT TO LIVE WITH FAMILY

At Casa de la Esperanza, they follow DIF guidelines and try to have a maximum of 12 children per dormitory. Each child has a file with detailed information on his or her family background, health, schooling, and origin. They promote sibling groups living together and have authorized family visits every Sunday. In addition, the psychologist who comes to the home provides counseling and therapy to ensure the well-being of the children.

RIGHT TO A STABLE, LOVING & NURTURING ENVIRONMENT

A loving and stable environment is created for the children, encouraging communal activities and mutual respect. Clear rules are established and positive discipline is used in case of infractions. The caregivers, with more than 10 years of experience, provide emotional stability, supported by regular training and frequent communication with the directors.

RIGHT TO GUIDANCE

A strict policy is implemented to prevent risk situations related to children's sexual behavior, including constant supervision, boundary education and access to psychological care. In addition, educational and professional support is provided to adolescents and young people, with clear rules and modeling of respectful behavior by staff. The priority is to create a safe and nurturing environment for the overall development of the children.

By working with A Child's Hope, we desire that our partners enhance their ability to and aspirations for collaboration. Our Deployment Partner, Child in Family Focus Kenya, continues to astound us with how they are building upon their own network and using the Thrive Program as a vehicle for connection.

A counselor at one of the children's homes has sought out another organization called Present Age to provide mentorship to all teenage children every Saturday. According to the United Nation's Rights of the Child, mentorship is a critical need for every kid, and data tells us it is one of the hardest to facilitate. The fact that the children's home with the help of our Deployment Partner is prioritizing meeting this need indicates an important shift: directors are better equipped to prioritize the needs of the kids in their care when they have support and coaching.

Redefining the paradigm for meeting the manifold needs of directors and kids is at the crux of our Thrive Program. We believe that the directors and caregivers and mentors are the heroes of their own story. Our role at A Child's Hope is to connect, equip, and then let them shine!


